Launched in June 2017 across 10,000 schools nationally, the CHOOSE**MATHS** Careers Awareness campaign is a key component of the Australian Mathematical Sciences Institute's (AMSI) five-year Choose Maths project funded by the BHP Billiton Foundation.

Industry remains clear in its demand and need for mathematics and statistics. This campaign aims to address public perception of maths careers and prepare young Australians, particularly girls for the future by highlighting these jobs, where they are and the skills needed.

Kev Aims:

- > **Promote** maths and statistics careers, in particular to girls and women
- > Inspire students, particularly girls stories of real people in maths and stats
- ➤ Increase awareness of jobs requiring maths and statistics
- ➤ Empower teachers and parents to foster maths and stats engagement, including through understanding of real-life context and application
- ➤ Improve Year 12 student higher level maths participation (advanced and intermediate) mathematics, in particular girls

Hidden Figures

In the lead up to this month's launch, Choose Maths has hosted screenings of Hidden Figures. Held in four major capital cities and attend by 1700 students, these sessions provided a preview of the campaign as ambassadors shared their stories and maths journeys with students. More screenings are planned.
